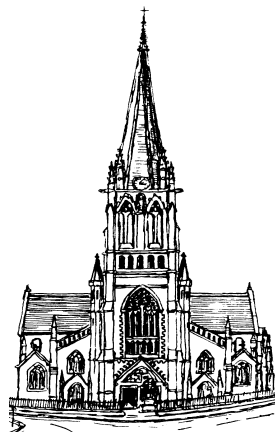

Jubilee

Jubilee was an important element in the religious tradition of the Jewish people. It came out of the people's awareness that once they had been slaves in Egypt, that God had taken pity on them and delivered them from such a miserable existence.

Jubilee refers to the sound of trumpets announcing the beginning of great celebrations. Every fifty years the usual ways of living together were to be radically renewed. Property was to be returned to original owners, all debts were to be cancelled and most tellingly; all slaves were to be set free. The lives of the people were to reflect something of the great Sabbath in which all things were to be reconciled and joy might be unconfined. Imagine!

This Sunday Vincentians all over the world celebrate the feast of St Vincent De Paul. To read some of the biographies of St Vincent you might think they were talking about Pope Francis. Vincent's reputation in France in the first half of the 17th century was phenomenal. His life's work was an attempt to realize jubilee in the lives of people who had been thoroughly discarded and forgotten.

In St Peter's we have a double cause for celebration this Sunday because we thank God for the vocation and fidelity of Fr Stephen Monaghan who celebrated the Silver Jubilee of his ordination during the week. Fr Stephen has spent twenty five years working with the Deaf community, the Travelling People, the Vincentian Lay Missionaries and most recently as chaplain to the students, faculty and staff in St Patrick's College, Drumcondra. We wish him many more years of ministry and every one resonating in Jubilee.

If the life and work of Vincentians today are to have any significance we must be committed to the hope that jubilee can be made real in everyone's lives, enriched by the experience of compassion and affirmation. May God give us all the grace to be as generous and committed as we need to be.
