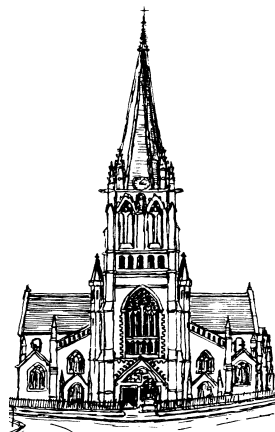

## FAMILY VALUES

When was the last time you attended a marriage or baptism ceremony? It's probably not that long ago; these celebrations tend to come around every year or two, and they are often big family occasions. When a family gathers in the church to celebrate a wedding or a baptism, it is a time to reflect on the role our faith plays in our lives. What has brought us here?

When a couple says their wedding vows, they promise to seek God together, in good times and bad; during a baptism, parents and godparents are reminded of their responsibility to bring their child up in the practice of the faith. There is no such thing as the perfect marriage or family. In the home, we can experience some of our greatest joys and our deepest hurts and sorrows. But it is also where we experience God's love, and do our best to pass it on.

Today's readings offer an opportunity to think about marriage and family. Somewhere along the line, someone in your family made the decision to follow Jesus. Your parents may have brought you to be baptised, just like their parents did for them, and so on down through the generations.

However you came to faith, the responsibility now rests with you. Jesus invited the little children to come to him. We have a responsibility to pass on the faith in our own families. 'May the Lord bless us all the days of our life' (Psalm 127).

**From Grangegorman to Tasmania**  
Public lecture 1.05pm, Monday 12 October, St Laurence's DIT, Grangegorman by Dr Christina Henri, Cascades Female Factory Historic Site, Tasmania. Hosted by Chaplaincy Service at DIT and supported by School of Arts & Tourism. Over 3,300 women and their children held in Grangegorman were transported to Van Diemen's Land between 1840 and 1853. Their lives irrevocably link Ireland and Tasmania, and today family members research ancestors in order to understand their lives.
