Church Gate Collection

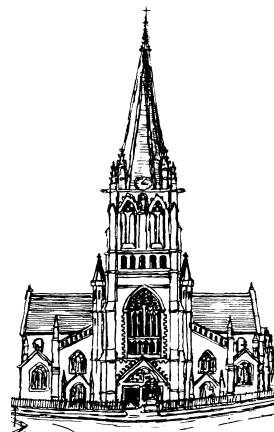

Parish Financial Report 2014-15

Dear Parishioners,

Allow me to present the parish financial report for the year 2014-15. The financial year for the parish runs from July 1 until June 30. This report therefore concludes on June 30 2015. As before the accounts have been audited by chartered accountants BFCD.

Once again I cannot adequately say how grateful I am to all of you the parishioners and visitors to St Peter's. You make St Peter's, which is to say, you are the parish and you make it a viable community.

The news this year is relatively good in that for the first time in a number of years we are able to report a surplus. St Peter's was fortunate to receive a legacy and a contribution from the Vincentian Community which offset some of the costs incurred in recent years repairing the roof of the church and other parts of the building. This has had a very positive effect on the parish accounts this year but if you look at the figures closely you will see there is no room really for complacency.

We continue to make savings in parish expenses, almost €8,000 from 2013-14, but our insurance costs are set to double this year as the value of the church has been reappraised in light of the destruction by fire and rebuilding of St Mel's Cathedral in Longford.

Therefore, I appeal to you to continue your support of the parish through the first collection taken at Sunday Masses and holy days of obligations which goes directly to the administration of the parish, as do the monies contributed in the weekly envelopes. Nothing from the first collection comes to the Vincentian Community. Other sums also come to the parish and these are listed under receipts. If I may suggest it please consider using the weekly envelopes which are a very efficient means of organizing your contribution and which make it easier to avail of the tax refund scheme set up by the Revenue Commissioners.

Thank you again for your unstinting generosity.
