When we hear the word 'king', images rush to mind. Kings have crowns, thrones and palaces. They make laws that their subjects are forced to obey. They have gold beyond measure and every comfort imaginable. Not this king. This king was born to peasants, treated all people the same, proclaimed messages that were neither followed nor popular, experienced brutal torture and died a condemned criminal.

What makes him a king? It's easy to rule through fear, to build an army and take land by force, to govern as Pilate did. It's also easy to rule by inciting a mob, as the high priest did. It is not easy to rule by showing unconditional love to your people, by tirelessly revealing the love of God through word and deed and by striving to build a world that reflects this truth. It's not easy to be a king in the world when your kingdom is not of the world.

The kingship of Christ is just as much at odds with our world today as it was with his two thousand years ago. We don't want to be dominated or subjected by a king. Indeed, we would have to be forced to do so. But Jesus does not force or bribe or sugar-coat. He lays the truth before us, just as he did for his followers and prosecutors alike, and invites us to follow him, to have him as our king. That's not a good way to build a kingdom on earth, but it's the only way to fulfil God's vision for our lives.

Unlike Pilate or the high priest, the sovereignty of Jesus does not depend on the will of the people to support it. Jesus is the Son of God, the eternal King whether we worship or not. We won't be beheaded for turning away. We will be loved to the core of our existence no matter what we do. Christ the King does not need our love to make him great, but every relationship is most fulfilling when the love is shared.


