CALLED TO TRANSFORMATION

Jesus takes the disciples up to the mountain top in todays Gospel. In that space, they have a profound experience and are invited to see Jesus for who He really is. One can empathize with the disciples in this story as they do not want to leave that space. We all have had experiences that we want to last forever and are hugely disappointed when they are over. However, commitment to any cause very often involves a long and painful journey. Like the disciples in the Gospel today, there is a 'hook' moment, when Jesus or any leader shows us something different. a vision, a dream, something that is so wonderful and hope-filled that we commit there and then to making it happen. Then we realise that there is much work to be done and the path will not be so easy. Obstacles will arise, people will fall away, enthusiasm will waver, there will be setbacks and disappointments. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a gradual process where adults have the opportunity to explore faith questions and learn the basic traditions, beliefs and practices of the Catholic Church. The RCIA process includes several rites and progresses in 4 stages, culminating in full initiation with the reception of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.
