# **First Holy Communion**

In the first reading at Mass this Sunday we hear about the moment when Jesus leaves his disciples for the second time. He had left once before at his crucifixion and death but the disciples experienced his return to them after his resurrection, although they learned that something had changed about him; he wasn't quite the same and yet they could recognise him with an even greater sense of who he was.

At the Ascension of Jesus into heaven, the disciples realise that their following Jesus was entering a new phase where they would experience him truly present to them and with them but not visibly or physically. It takes a while for this to sink in. They can still be astonished by Jesus. They are asked, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky?'

Today the boys and girls in our First Communion class finally arrive at their big day. Today they will receive Christ truly present to them in the Eucharist for the first time. We congratulate them and their families for preparing so thoroughly for this moment. We are so thankful that God's love and care for them is reflected in the love and care that surrounds them every day and that God's work is coming to fulfilment in them. We pray as well that our First Communion class will always have that deep sense that God is always with them, present to them in the body and blood of his risen Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. We may not 'see' him but we can recognise him in each other, in the readings from the Bible we hear at Mass, in the ministry of those who read for us or from whom we receive holy communion and of course in the 'breaking of the bread' itself.

## Venerable John Sullivan

Pope Francis has approved the beatification of Venerable John Sullivan (1861-1933). Many miracles have been attributed to the Jesuit priest who was baptised into the Church of Ireland and became a Roman Catholic in the second half of his life. His early education was at Trinity College. Much of his priestly life was spent in Clongowes Wood College, Co. Kildare. Word of his healing ways spread around Ireland and thousands visit his tomb in Gardiner Street with deep devotion, praying for his help and intercession for healing. Archbishop Diarmuid Martin and Archbishop Michael Jackson, Church of Ireland Archbishop of Dublin have joined together several times in prayer for Fr Sullivan at Gardiner St, which holds the John Sullivan Cross. Archbishop Martin has said John Sullivan's seeking for God led him towards the Catholic Church and then towards priestly ordination, but he never renounced the initial formation he had received in the tradition of the Church of Ireland, "John Sullivan's faith was the product of two traditions and always remained so and was enriched by that fact." Fr Conor Harper SJ says the news will delight many throughout the world, especially in Ireland. "What is remarkable about Fr John Sullivan has been the manner in which he is remembered and revered in the two Christian traditions that were so dear to him, the Roman Catholic and the Protestant, Our Church of Ireland friends join us in celebration."
