The word 'martyr' comes from the Greek and it means a witness. To be a martyr was to be a witness. It was to be a witness to a power greater than that which sought to oppress, to destroy and to end the divine life which flows through each of us.

The first reading represents any martyrdom of any believer. Down through the centuries, Christians have been tortured for their faith. And down through the centuries, Christians have tortured other men and women of other faiths, believing it to be the work of God. It still hasn't ended. Still today people of faith are being persecuted for their beliefs. Martyrdom is a reality that sadly is not likely to become obsolete soon.

No one grows up wanting to be a martyr. Circumstances and history have led people to have to choose between what they believe in and rejection of that belief. Throughout the world today, prisoners of conscience are in jails for what they believe. What marks a Christian martyr, among other things, is the solid and absolute belief in the resurrection. Knowing that we have here 'no abiding city' means that the privations or torture that a martyr endures is secondary to the promise of the Kingdom of God.

In these dark and dreary days of November, as the church year is coming to a close, this is a time for remembering the dead. It might be worth considering and praying for people who sacrificed themselves for us or for others; who gave up their own personal dreams and ambitions to look after a sick parent or relative, who stayed at home on the farm or in the family business so that another could go away to college or to work. These might seem to be small sacrifices, but in our minds and hearts they remain a sure and solid witness to the grace of God in the soul of that person.

Holy Doors of Mercy - Closing

As the Jubilee Year of Mercy comes to an end, Holy Doors that have been opened will close around the world. Archbishop Diarmuid Martin will close the Holy Door of Mercy in St Mary's Pro-Cathedral before 11.00am Mass on Sunday, 13 November. You are invited to cross the Holy Door at the Pro-Cathedral any day between now and 13 November. The door chosen by Archbishop Martin (an entrance to the left of the main door on Marlborough St) leads into an area of the Pro-Cathedral that has two confessionals, and a statue memorial to the Venerable Matt Talbot, whose life was healed from addiction when he encountered God's mercy. The Door also looks to the altar of St Laurence O'Toole, Patron of the Archdiocese, celebrated as a man of mercy. Holy Doors of Mercy will also close on same date in Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Sean Mc Dermott Street, Dublin, where the remains of the Venerable Matt Talbot lie; the Church of St Francis Xavier in Gardiner Street, which holds the Cross of the Venerable John Sullivan; the Parish Church of Ss. Peter and Mary in Arklow; and also at the House of Mercy in Baggot Street, Dublin established in 1827 by Catherine McAuley, foundress of the Sisters of Mercy.
