Love according to the heart God gave us

The focus of this weeks readings is our love for God and His love for us. Quite often we can find it difficult to understand God's love for us because we feel that we are not worthy of it. A couple of years ago, the glass house I had lived in for most of my life came crashing down to the ground. I began a new life outside the safety of those walls. At first, it didn't feel safe. But it felt true. I saw myself as a broken lamb limping after the Shepherd, not knowing where He was going but knowing wherever He went, I would go with Him. To this very day, I remain completely convinced of one thing: the Shepherd loves me. The words that I would have sung as a child feel more real to me today than ever: Jesus loves me, this I know.

The remarkable thing about the Gospel is that each week we have the opportunity to rediscover the heart and the meaning of it. During life we find ourselves broken, lost and weak, feeling as though we are unworthy of God's love. However, the Gospel holds the power to remind us that even when we feel this way we can simply just let God love us. We find ourselves with holes in our hearts and we get to let God love us even with those holes. In order to love according to the heart God gave us, this means loving through the wounds He permitted by not ignoring them, not denying them and not allowing ourselves to be consumed by them. Instead choosing to love through them. This means allowing them to be open to receive His healing love. Showing love to all those he places in my path especially those who are hard to love. Pope John Paul II in his final homily stated, "As a gift to humanity, which sometimes seems bewildered and overwhelmed by the power of evil, selfishness and fear, the Risen Lord offers his love that pardons, reconciles and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace."

Our goal in life is not to be no longer weak or little but to love God as much as he can be loved by YOUR heart even if it is broken. In the words of Fr Guillermo Campuzan CM, our goal is to fall in love with God in an absolute way.

Ecumenical Bible Week

Takes place from Pentecost (4 June) to Trinity Sunday (11 June). There's a wide variety in the programme this year, including a symposium on the Reformation and *Thinking Allowed*. It is recommended to book for the Symposium, which will be held on Friday, 9 June from 2.00pm, chaired by Archbishop Michael Jackson, consisting of two papers and a discussion. Prof. Tony Lane will open the proceedings with a discussion of the agreed statement on justification, signed by the World Lutheran Federation and the Roman Catholic Church. The second paper, by Prof Salvador Ryan, asks the question 'How should we remember the Reformation?' The Thinking Allowed event, also on Friday, 9th at 7.30pm, offers again reflections, this time from four different traditions. They will all respond to one question: Is the Reformation over?
