Pentecost Sunday 4 June 2017



Pentecost is commonly described as the birthday of the Christian Church as we know it. For the first time, the followers of Jesus of Nazareth had the courage to go out into the world and proclaim that he was the Messiah, that he had risen, that he would come again and that life would no longer be the same. This event cannot be overstated, either in religious or sociological terms.

Jesus was executed as a common criminal, condemned by both the Sanhedrin and the Roman governor as a blasphemer and a threat to the empire. Following his death, his followers dispersed and went into hiding as was to be expected. That should really have been the end of it. Even the rumours that the body was gone, whether stolen or resurrected, did not give them the courage to come forth. The time Jesus spent with them after his resurrection renewed their faith and gave them peace, but not the ability to profess it. It was only when Jesus made good on his promise to send his spirit to be with them that the disciples were able to face their fear of persecution and death for the sake of the Gospel.

The disciples were given the gift of speaking in other languages. The crowd remark on how they each hear these men from Galilee speaking in their own native language. But perhaps there is more to it than that. Speaking on matters of faith is never easy for any of us. Language always falls short. Emotion always intrudes. Perhaps the real gift of the Spirit was in enabling the disciples to profess their faith in a way that others could truly understand. Their success is astounding. We are later told that three thousand people in Jerusalem were baptised that day into this illegal rebel cult led by uneducated men who had followed a carpenter-turned-prophet for three years. In sociological terms, it defies convention. But for those of faith, it is the Spirit of God at work, the realisation of his perfect plan and a testament to just how much the love of God transcends human limitation.




