Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time 25 June 2017

Do Not Be Afraid

This Sunday's Gospel calls us to be courageous and proud witnesses to Christ. It calls out to us to be people who are not afraid to be identified as Christians and members of the Catholic Church. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus instructs his followers about the requirement and challenges of continuing his mission in this world. He knows that it is not going to be easy, He realises that we are going to come up against opposition in our encounters with people during our lifetime. At the same time, he wants his disciples and his followers to be free of fear and full of trust in God's faithful care for them. In the midst of the distinct challenge that Jesus places before us, he offers words that are consoling and strengthening. "Even all the hairs on your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."

For many of us, we struggle with Jesus' words about not being afraid in the face of opposition. All of us encounter moments and situations when the opinions of others, and the pressures to conform, make it difficult for us to stand up for our faith in Christ. Throughout my time working within the Church, I have realized that faith is not something that all people feel open about discussing. Quite often we are afraid to simply speak about our own faith. I run a youth prayer group in my home parish and after one of our meetings I was chatting to a young man called Tom. Tom is a big fan of sports especially hurling, he does well at school and is very sociable. During our conversation he revealed to me that he felt faith was a very important part of his life, however outside the prayer group he felt he couldn't talk about his faith to any of his friends because he was afraid of how they would treat him, he was afraid in case he would be left out.

During my own time in college, some of my peers spoke very personally about the challenges to their faith that they meet among their friends and sometimes even among their own family members. At the time we were discerning a life of service in the Church we would have to listen to people who, in subtle or more explicit ways, discouraged us from pursuing such a vocation. We are in a society now where sometimes we fear speaking as individuals in case we stand out from the crowd and are left out from our peers. When we listen to the encouraging words that Jesus speaks in Matthew's Gospel this week "There is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than a hundred sparrows"; it gives us the confidence to stand up and be proud to say that we belong to God. No matter what anyone else might say or think about us.


