Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 13 August 2017

### 'Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.'

(from the Feast Day readings)

Every day I watch the Mass goers stream in through the Cabra Road door without ever giving a thought to the two carved panels either side of the entrance. The space is so dominated by the Shrine to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal that the panels hardly get any attention, though one of them provides a useful plinth on which to write petitions. In fact, the twin carvings, one of Christ risen from the dead, and the second, of Mary rising into Heaven, provide a perfect image for the way I now think of the feast of the Assumption - a celebration of the Resurrection and its implications for each one of us. It was not always so.

As a child, the 15<sup>th</sup> of August meant only one thing, the "Big Fair Day in Belmullet". My grandmother gave us half a crown, and sent us off to spend it. Oh wonderful liberation, without any restriction! I gambled part of it, at a hucksters roulette table, bought ice-cream with part of it, and one glorious summer, at least, bought stink bombs! I am not sure that my granny entirely approved of the latter purchase, but she said nothing. There were no boundaries on the 15<sup>th</sup> of August. I have absolutely no memory of Mass, but as it is a Holy Day, I am sure we went. No priest's sermon from those days stays with me, but even St Thomas Aquinas himself could not have competed with the impatient dreams of delights to come in the Market Square once sacred duty had been attended to. 1977 changed all that forever, and the day became the marker of my mother's death. We should have realised that the cancer we thought banished had returned, the photographs make it obvious, but detection was not as good then as now, and her death came as a sudden and quiet devastation. At the time, the words of religion could dull, but not take away the pain of immediate grief, but later, the connection to the Assumption brought real and enduring consolation. In the raising of the Mother of Jesus, body and soul I could see a foretaste of my own mother's future, at peace in her place in Paradise. The, up to then, theoretical faith in the resurrection becomes real, when you imagine someone you love not moldering in a grave for eternity, but waiting only for the trumpet sound to be raised in Glory to where Mary has already gone. It is this idea of the Assumption that shapes my thinking of this feast even to this day.

I have long since lost the need to buy stink bombs on this feast day and the sadness I feel on this day has long ago been replaced by a peaceful remembrance of a good mother. Instead, I think of this day as a joyful celebration of Christ's Resurrection, precisely because the raising of Our Lady, body and soul to paradise is proof, if such were needed, that the Resurrection actually works! Christ is alive, his tomb is empty, and the process of drawing all of us to Him in Heaven has already begun!

The Cabra Road door seems to capture the idea perfectly. To the right is Jesus raised from the dead, and to the left is Mary Assumed into Heaven, while between them, streaming in from outside are the rest of us, coming to find the place with them that He has won for us and she assures us actually exists. I will be celebrating the feast in far away Beijing, but in my mind I will be looking at the two panels, and giving thanks that Christ's goodness and Our Lady's fidelity give me hope that death is not the end and greater glories are still to come.

Death is swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where. O death, is your sting?


