Does the bird sing in the South?

In the play "Murder in the Cathedral", the women of Canterbury ask anxiously "does the bird sing in the south" hoping that some small sign of spring will relieve their foreboding that evil is afoot. The absence of bird song in the south is the first sign that things are not right in the world, hinting at the dreadful murder to come of St Thomas a Beckett in his own cathedral. This week, by contrast, on 8 September we celebrate the Nativity of our Lady, a feast that suggests the opposite of foreboding; here there is hope because the bird does sing! The cry of a girl child, born to a previously childless couple, is a sign that the Messiah is coming, the waiting is drawing to a close.

Waiting for what? During the years of the Roman Occupation, the women and men of Jerusalem were waiting for a sign, something that would give them hope that the invader was not part of some dreadful unravelling of God's plan for his people. They read the scriptures and scanned the skies for some consolation, some evidence that God had not deserted them. Many were persuaded by false prophets, who acted big but could not deliver, when all the while God's plan was unfolding, a bird was singing in the south, but by looking in the wrong place, by listening for the wrong sign, they missed it.

In a house near Jerusalem's Sheep Gate, on 8 September the cry of a newborn was heard. The birth, though the couple were older, probably didn't cause a stir beyond the immediate neighbourhood. Yet that wordless cry of a new born girl child would eventually take form and become her definitive "yes" to the most extraordinary partnership between God and humanity in history, a partnership that would result in the birth of the Messiah.

As a sign of extraordinary things to come, the birth cry of a girl child in a middle-eastern provincial capital is a bit bland; no bells and whistles, no eclipses or earthquakes to demand our attention. The problem is a failure to appreciate that the Messiah, the Christ, was not that kind of Messiah, and by expecting the wrong signs, it is impossible to see that, in a girl's birth, the extraordinary plan of God is unfolding exactly as intended. The Human partner in God's wonderful act of Redemption is born, soon she will grow up to give birth, in turn, to the Saviour. In Canterbury, there was no birdsong to give hope against despair. In Jerusalem, the sound of Mary's birth cry is a hint of the great things in store, the Messiah will soon come, REJOICE!

Your birth, O Virgin Mother of God, heralded joy to all the world.


