Jesus the Healer

In today's gospel we read about Jesus' first healing in Mark's Gospel. Jesus hears of the illness of the mother of Simon's wife and goes to her. Due to the purity laws of his time this scene would have been considered controversial. His first healing is of a woman and we are told that he touches her, raises her up; he completely restores her to health. Many of his actions here would be considered taboo.

The 'whole city' was crowded around the door as people wanted to also be healed. What a commotion! Jesus, very early on in his ministry, is clearly a very popular, attractive figure. Jesus is the healer. We might ask ourselves today: who do we know who is in need of healing of any kind? This week, how can we reach out to them?

Another important aspect of this story is that Jesus does not remain comfortable in this house. He keeps moving, keeps going outward. This requires so much energy and an outpouring of love for those in need. Jesus shows us in today's gospel what it takes to stay connected, to re-energise ourselves for our various tasks: quiet time and space for real encounter with God. Even then, the people hunted for him. *'Everyone is searching for you'*, and still today, everyone is searching. It is up to all of us to help those on this journey, the seekers, the lost and those in need of healing. We cannot break new ground unless we are inwardly free and connected to that divine presence within us and in our world.

Blessed Rosalie Rendu DC

February 7 is the feast day of Blessed Rosalie Rendu DC, whose humble "example and message continue to reverberate in the minds and hearts of those who are seeking to relieve the plight of those who are poor and abandoned"* today.

"Sr Rosalie responded to calamities. During the revolution of 1830 she gave asylum to the archbishop as well as to many other priests. During the cholera epidemic of 1832, she quickly gathered orphan children and had her Sisters care for them, thus beginning an orphanage. By 1838 the Sisters' soup kitchen was providing some 2,000 poor with a daily ration. Expenses never seemed to worry Sr Rosalie as, indeed, she saw the open hand of Providence securing what was needed for God's poor.

During the revolution of 1848, her relationship with the poor inhabitants of the Mouffetard district was such that she was able to put an end to the bloodshed. Like another hero, Archbishop Denis Auguste Affre of Paris, killed by a bullet from the height of the barricades when he sought to end the revolutionaries' violence, Sr Rosalie fearlessly climbed to the top of the barricades in her district and addressed the crowd: "Do you think that I want to go on living when my children are being slaughtered? Stop this shooting! Haven't I enough widows and orphans to care for? Do you want to give me more?" Though the fighting continued elsewhere in the city, the struggle ceased there. In 1852, to acknowledge her years of dedication, Emperor Napoleon III bestowed on Sr Rosalie the cross of the Legion of Honour. Seeing that she did not wear it, he sent, in 1854, a gold cross he hoped she would wear, since it contained relics of St Vincent de Paul. Rosalie Rendu gradually lost her sight and contracted other illnesses. She died 7 February 1856, at age seventy, from the effects of pleurisy. She had given fifty -four years of her life to the care of the poor."



On 21 August 1997, Pope John Paul II beatified Frederic Ozanam, the principal founder of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, at Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris. In his homily, the Holy Father evoked Sr Rosalie's name. He stated,

"The bonds among the members of the Vincentian Family have been strong since the origin of the Society because it was a Daughter of Charity, Sr Rosalie Rendu, who guided the young Frederic Ozanam and his companions toward persons who were poor in the Mouffetard section of Paris."
