First Sunday of Lent 18 February 2018



From Ashes to Glory - Our Lenten Journey

This first week of Lent is the time we are given to begin our Lenten patterns, to re-align our priorities, and to make use of more reflective time each day. It is a time to fast and abstain from those things that hinder our relationship with the Lord, and to consider being more generous to the poor.

As we make this beginning, we are offered some beautiful instruction about what is expected of us. These readings describe a very Jesus-like love. We can examine our care for the hungry, thirsty, naked, sick or imprisoned. We can reflect upon who in our lives needs us and whether we love them as we want to be loved. And we can look at the deeper things, like our anger or how we treat others, and our response to those who are our "enemies." What is most important this first week, beyond a sharper examination of our consciences, is to see this as a time for God's grace to work in us. So, it is a time to ask for the graces we are starting to see we need.

Each morning this week we can ask our Lord to help us focus this day on the neediest people around us. We can ask to begin new patterns this week by practicing special charity and love, where I haven't been so generous or kind before. The key is to ask and to be very specific. Then, **throughout the day**, we can keep talking with our Lord, in the background about these graces we ask for and the concrete circumstances we find ourselves in. It is in the particular events of our day that we will become attentive to our need for our Lord's presence and grace, as well as our need to choose a new pattern. **Each evening**, we can briefly review the day and recognize some missed opportunities to connect with the Lord or take advantage of a situation here or there, but most of all, we can thank the Lord for the moments of connection that have begun our Lenten journey.

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ

I come to you every year at this time, around the feast of St Valentine, to ask for your help and support for the work of the Diocesan agency, ACCORD Dublin. ACCORD has for many years now, quietly and steadily, continued to support people across the Diocese develop strong, positive and lasting relationships.

ACCORD's work involves working with primary and secondary students exploring intellectual development, spiritual and emotional development and their understanding of relationships be it with family, friendships or whomever. We work with engaged couples helping them prepare for the Sacrament of Marriage and create a solid foundation on which to build their marriage and we are there for people who are experiencing difficulty in their relationship or marriage with our counselling service.

In 2017 over 30,000 primary and secondary schools students and 4,000 adults, couples and individuals, sought the help of ACCORD Dublin. Based on this level of demand there is clearly a need for the services of ACCORD. All services are provided free to those who cannot afford to make a donation.

While ACCORD does receive donation income from many clients and funding from TUSLA, the Child and Family Agency, we still need your support to close the gap between the monies we receive and the cost of offering these services, particularly the counselling service.

Pope Francis has spoken on many occasions about the need for all of us to meet people in whatever circumstances life has given them and to walk with them in compassion and love. This is what ACCORD does but to continue doing so we need your help.

I thank you for your support of ACCORD in years past and pray that the light of God will shine brightly on you and your families in the coming years.
