All are Welcome in this Place

When Phibsborians bless themselves at the doors of St Peter's they know they are entering a safe sanctuary, a place of welcome and security where they can meet God and neighbour away from the challenges of daily life. Building that confidence has been the life's work of many Vincentians, staff and volunteers since 'Peter's opened its doors in 1838. In the case of the vulnerable, we know from the bitter experience of the Church in Dublin, that maintaining such confidence today and into the future, involves a vigilance about child safety that would have been unimaginable even a generation ago. We are committed to being a trusted place of welcome for children and have adapted that new way of being vigilant to our welcome at St Peter's.

Some of the "new vigilance" ways of working are mandated now by law, for example Garda Vetting, which is common in many areas of public life. However the diocese, in some cases, has demanded a higher standard again. This is to ensure that those who entrust their children to the care of St Peter's priests, staff and volunteers know that such trust is deserved.

The changes required have been demanding and have disturbed rhythms and routines of volunteers whose generous work seems unrelated to children. It is not, for example, at first glance obvious why a Reader at Mass needs to go through Garda vetting to proclaim God's Word. But when you see that if we are to keep children at the heart of St. Peter's, *all* who minister and with whom they come in contact must be up to the standard of the new vigilance. The generosity of our volunteers in adjusting to the changes is an example to us all. It makes the continued warm welcome possible.

We are very grateful for the trust parents and guardians of young people and vulnerable adults place in us here at St Peter's. We are also aware of the responsibilities that flow from such trust: May I ask you for your prayers for my colleagues and I, so that we discharge our responsibilities in this matter with humility and a wisdom that only God can give.


