# The Feast of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal

It would be easy to be of the opinion that devotion to Our Lady under this title is, at best, an expression of faith that is as irrelevant as gas lights and the horse drawn tram. The prayers themselves have a Victorian, florid quality and for an Irish devotee, their emphasis on virginal purity, conjures up repressed sexuality in an age when we have decided that the opposite is preferable and without it our own set of complications. Finally St Catherine herself seems an unlikely role model for modern women of faith in an age which no longer channels such women towards either choice of religious life or the domestic hearth.

There is however a nagging doubt, a sense that there is more hidden in the respectable piety of the remaining "Medelers" than meets the eye. Two advocates come to mind, people of calibre and heroic virtue who promoted the devotion: Maximilian Kolbe and Catherine Labouré. Neither were likely to carry smelling salts against an attack of the vapours, and in their different ways, lived the Faith to the full, one of them even to the extraordinary extent of, in horrific circumstances, offering his life that another might live. If a devotion to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal played any part in them growing into such a deep and mature faith as they had, then to dismiss it as passé is a lazy presumption.

There remains in the language a risk of promoting a model of the feminine that is out of touch with modern realities. In our society, the language of "virginal purity of mind and body" are off-putting to many. I certainly found it so when I, once again, began to recite the novena prayers with any regularity. I cannot say I have yet fully reconciled myself to the language, but, for now, have come to accept that, in a sexualised society, there remains a need to promote to both women and men a holistic concept of purity which includes, but more importantly, is not confined to sex; promoting a purity of mind and body, a *purity of intention*, if you will, in all aspects of a life lived in faith. I hope that in St Peter's in the three days of Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, (26, 27 and 28 Nov) you will come and, hopefully, experience personally the passionate attachment to the Son of God which inspired Maximilian Kolbe and Catherine Labouré and become, like them, promoters of devotion to his His Mother - Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal.
