### That Was A Magic Teacher!

A reflection for Catholic Schools Week

A pupil from the '50's wrote of St Peter's School;

"I.... went to St Peter's. My first teacher was Miss Gannon and then Mrs Finnucane. She used to have us jumping in the yard yelling "ag pioca úla" (picking apples) one hand after the other in the air as we jumped. Then I went upstairs to Mossy O'Connor's class.... Anyone who could play football or hurling made out well in Mossy's class. .... That was a magic teacher!"

That was then and this is now. In the country generally, schools' curriculum is the battle-ground of a culture war as to how we define ourselves in the new Ireland, with less and less space for religion or the humanities, much less jumping in the yard with Miss Gannon's successor. Following the culture wars only in the papers, as I had been doing, would leave you feeling not only that Catholic Ireland was dead and gone, but that the country's education system gone down with it.

Coming back I find that this is not true. The faces at the school gate on St Peter's Road in the morning are more diverse, but the confidence remains that inside the school walls our children will be educated professionally and will learn a respect for each other's differences. This calm environment is not achieved without a cost, one borne by our teachers. They have the next to impossible task of meeting departmental demands, as well as provide both traditional religious education and cater for those who make other choices. Yet when the school gate opens, those stresses are invisible and the 'joy' of inspiring a new generation of children to be more than themselves begins, as if effortlessly.

**This week is Catholic Schools Week**. If you have any connection with a school, especially our own St Peter's, thank a teacher for educating our children so well in such an extraordinary time of change. There were magic teachers in St Peter's back in the "olden times", we are lucky we still have their likes with us today – Magic.



### Garda Vetting at St Peter's is Even Simpler

New volunteers wishing to apply for Garda Vetting can now simply download an **NVB 1** form from our website, <u>www.stpetersphibsboro.ie</u> or pick up a paper copy from the Parish Office or the Sacristy.

Applications to the National Vetting Bureau are completed electronically in a process known as E-Vetting. There are two stages to the process.

### Stage 1: NVB 1

Complete Sections 1 & 2 of The Vetting Invitation Form (NVB 1). Specify the role you are volunteering for e.g. Eucharistic Minister, Choir Member, Reader etc. Drop it back in an envelope to the Parish Office /Sacristy or by post to Marion McCormack Administrator, St Peter's Church, Phibsborough, Dublin 7.

The law requires you to provide two forms of identity, one of which is photographic e.g. driving licence, passport or public service card. Section 3 will be completed by Fr Aidan (PP) and a witness (member of Safeguarding committee).

### Stage 2: NVB 2

You will receive an email from the National Vetting Bureau with their Online Application Form (NVB2). You are asked to complete this form online within 30 days of receiving it. You will receive acknowledgement of it being accepted.

If you don't have an email address or access to a computer, please don't worry, the parish will provide one for you and will assist you in completing the online application.

While this process is time consuming and even a bit challenging at times, it is worthwhile when it helps produce a safe, secure and healthy space and place where we can all worship freely and joyfully. Thank you.
