The Baptism of the Lord 13 January 2019



When we think of Baptism we usually think of babies. But today's Gospel has no babies - and yet it's about Baptism. Jesus, the one Baptised, is an *adult*. And his Baptism is the start of his mission.

What would it be like for us if, when we think of Baptism, we think, not babies, but adults? What would it be like if, when we think about Baptism, we think about ourselves? Let's ask ourselves: where is my Baptism?

When the family come home after the baby's Baptism, the candle is often put away in a drawer. Is that what happened us? Our Baptism is put away safely and forgotten. It's something that 'got done' way back then.

But Baptism isn't meant to be put safely away. Jesus says, don't hide your light under a cover, let it shine for all to see. My Baptism is a light that is shining now. It's more than something done to me when I was a baby and then forgotten about or put away safely. It's *now* – about me as an adult.

And if I have forgotten my Baptism, then today's Gospel is inviting me to 'activate' my Baptism – to take it out from being hidden under a cover or put away in a drawer. To feel its comfort, to hear its call, to know its power.

My Baptism is not 'then', it's 'now'!

My Baptism can shine out. It's in my smile that radiates a good feeling. It's in my heart that holds positive feelings for other people. It's in my ears that listen attentively to what another person wants to say. It's in my hands when I lend a hand and help. It's in every word I pray.

My Baptism is the feeling I have when I know God loves me – like Jesus in today's Gospel, I am *Beloved*. Hopefully we each have that feeling of being loved every day when we pray.

My Baptism is the call I feel when someone needs me or there is something I can do – like Jesus in today's Gospel, I am called. Hopefully we each have that feeling every day, the call to put our faith into action.

When I allow my Baptism light to shine, then the world is a different place, a better place. Let's all make a new start today with our Baptism. Let's make it 'now' and not 'back then'. Let us all activate our Baptism!




