## Happy Mothers Day

In the warm "Hallmark" version of Mothers Day that we are bombarded with it can be easy to miss the complex challenge that being a mother is, even if one is expecting or have given birth in the happiest of circumstances. Women's difficult pregnancy stories fill the news cycle, adding to stress levels, even if, sad as each case is, they are a tiny fraction of the women who carry children successfully to term every day in this country. Finding oneself to be "with child" is about enduring 9 months of a rollercoaster ride of new and confusing experiences, but with the added complication that when the ride ends, the exit leads only to an even more complicated reality - raising a child.

I can only imagine what being a mother involves so I asked the very helpful Cuidiu team to do some market research, and they came up with some wise insights. The things that can catch you from left field as a new mother is the anxiety of a situation where everything is new and there seems to be no skill set to draw on, "have you done the nappy up properly?" sits alongside "she seems warm, is that a fever?" and, the fear is that both will lead to fatal consequences if I don't get it right. There is no normal, it's all a scary new world. Sleep becomes a thing of the past, and constant tiredness the new reality. Focus changes and nothing is more important than what you do for your baby. There are new and unexpected joys as well that only a mother can feel, such as just gazing at your new-born and realising how someone so new and small can make you so in awe and fill your life completely. Or the surprise that there is within you such an extraordinary depth of love for this child you have given birth to.

Another joy is the solidarity you suddenly feel with all the other mums pushing prams through supermarkets when you hardly gave them a glance before.

In Phibsborough there is a further challenge for new or expectant mothers from other countries without their natural support networks to guide them through this scary time. The good news is there is help out there, even in some of the main languages Polish, French and Romanian (see Cuidiu, inside pages, for details).

Mothers Day is a day to honour the women who gave us birth for enduring the rollercoaster that brings us to life and also to support the woman among us who are beginning this scary joyful journey in our midst. Blessings on all of you this day.

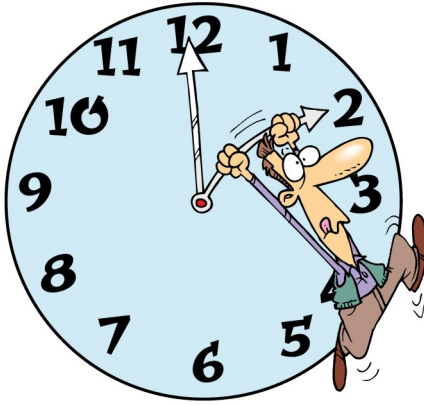
