The Most Holy Trinity 16 June 2019



HOSPITALITY the earth.

A copy of Andrei Rublev's icon of the Trinity rests on an easel in our sanctuary today. Created in 1411, it became the quintessential icon of the Holy Trinity by depicting the three mysterious strangers who visited Abraham (Genesis 18:1-15).

In the Genesis account the Lord visits Abraham in the form of three persons who are apparently angels representing God. Abraham offers them the hospitality of foot washing, rest under a shade tree, and a meal. In this icon, Abraham and Sarah are completely absent. The Three Angels lean toward each other in mutual love, their hands held in a blessing directed toward the centre. The table is now unmistakably an altar, a single chalice

Many in Rublev's culture were confused by the doctrine of the Trinity and others rejected it altogether. Rublev's icon showed them a lovely understanding of God as Three-in-One that is beyond trying to "figure out." It continues to draw people into the mysterious and wonderful presence of the Trinity.

A DIVINE OF Each of the three hold rods of divine authority, and sit elevated so that their feet do not touch

> Fr Aidan CM The simplicity of the Icon is captivating. The Three Angels, whilst distinct persons, each possess a striking similarity to the other, producing a harmony between them. As they lean toward each other, we follow their gaze from one, to the other, and back again. As we witness the intimate conversation between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we are invited to participate: not only in contemplation of the Icon, but in all aspects of our life.

> > The more we look at this holy image with the eves of faith, the more we come to realize that it is painted not as a lovely decoration for a monastery church, nor as a helpful explanation of a difficult doctrine, but as a holy place to enter and stay within.

As we place ourselves in front of the Icon in prayer, we come to experience a gentle invitation to participate in the intimate conversation that is taking place among the three divine angels and to join them around the table.


