WHO AM I TO JUDGE?

This week, Dublin will be awash with rainbow flags to celebrate Gay Pride. Given the changes in western society, there is much to celebrate. Being gay was considered a mental illness by the United Nations as recently as 1990. Laws made private behaviour between consenting men, illegal in Ireland until 1993. Discriminations, big or small, which a generation ago would have been considered socially acceptable are no longer tolerated. The removal of fear from the discovery of one's orientation is worth celebrating, let the parades begin.

The absence of a Catholic voice in the celebrations is disappointing, because many of the changes in the way that gay people are treated is worth celebrating within the Church as on the street, but is not done. Silence reigns in most Catholic Church's across Dublin, even as the parade is going past the church doors. It gives the impression we are inside nursing our homophobia and bemoaning the "good old days". The silence gives space to other voices who mix truth and half-truth about our faith, and come up with a version of our teachings that are easy to mock

because they are ridiculous. What is one to do?

This silence means that nobody says out loudly and clearly that gay men and women are loved by God, no buts, no exception, no caveat. It's a statement of the obvious of course, as is the idea that a gay Catholic is as much a Catholic as a straight one. But somehow these truths are not heard along the parade route. The other obvious truth, that all Catholics are called to chastity outside marriage and openness to creating children together within it, but the silence means no conversation on this issue, leaving the space to those within the Church and outside it who shout distortions of our Faith past each other, the one not hearing a word the other is saying.

This week, if you're Gay and Catholic enjoy the opportunity to celebrate who you are without fear. Listen carefully to the voices who will speak about your faith and your church, and if they sound somehow off, they probably are, no matter who is speaking. There are challenges for all of us in living the moral life, but if one is grounded in the certainty of God's Love, one can be at the same time, Catholic, Gay and Proud.


