

The Crosscare Annual Collection for Community, Homeless and Youth services will take place this

weekend. Last year Crosscare saw almost 1,000 people accommodated in their homeless services and helped 78 families and over 100 individuals move into their own homes. Through their food banks and meal services, over 175,000 meals were distributed to those in need and 14,000 parcels of food were delivered to families.
