Sombre pleasure alone can grant what he desires, the real meaning of life. All he finds is a **Bank Holiday** Reflections

Does life have any meaning? This particular needling question pops up when we hit a crisis, a season of depression, a time of change. This Sunday's first reading proposes a very sombre answer. All is Vanity!

What is the answer?

"Vanity of vanities, says Qoheleth". This first line of the reading contains the message and the mysteries of the book of Ecclesiastes as a whole. Ecclesiastes is a reflection on what it means to be human. Alongside Qoheleth, we search high and low for answers to the gnawing fear inside of us that we're all alone, that all of life is useless and we'll just end up six feet under ground. He takes this fear by the horns and stares it in the face, offering up the most despairing of answers - there is no answer.

Searching for Meaning

Qoheleth sets up the whole book as a search for fulfilment, but neither wisdom or

ing these desires takes a lot of work, but their satisfaction does not result in the kind of happiness he is looking for: The doomand-gloom conclusion Qoheleth reaches reminds us of what this Sunday's gospel teaches: that you can't take it with you. Qoheleth brings us face to face with the deepest questions that we should be asking, struggling with and seeking answers for. He helps us feel the pain and emptiness that a selfish, sinful life brings - a meaningless existence, "a tale told by an idiot, full of sound and fury signifying nothing." From that low point of desperation, we can turn to God, seeking the answers to our longing for meaning in his Word, in his Son, in his Sacraments. We will find that life is far from the meaninglessness Qoheleth finds. Instead, we are made for a beautiful, eternal communion. the ultimate fulfilment of our nature through going out of ourselves in love for Him and being filled by Him in return.




LOUGH DERG **THREE-DAY** PILGRIMAGE
