Ireland's Call

When the first Irish members of the Society of St. Vincent dePaul came together in St. Michen's Church down the road in 1844, they had responded to a call deep in each one of them to fulfil their Christian duty in an organised and novel way that was coming out of France at the time. That early enthusiasm must have been sorely tested within a year by the arrival of the potato famine, but they rose to the challenge, drawing on the inspiration of their patron St. Vincent dePaul, the saint of organised charity. The members of the SVP have been adapting ever since to the changes in Irish life, organising around the needs of the poorest and most vulnerable in our communities with creativity and flair. That adaptability has seen the SVP grow from one conference in St. Michen's (the second group started here in St. Peter's) to being the best known and most widely supported organisation of social concern and action in Ireland, with over eleven thousand members in every county in Ireland.

The **Ireland of today** is very different to the one which existed in 1844, and many of the forms of poverty have, happily, been eradicated. However, despite our recovering economy there are nearly 800,000 living below the poverty line including 100,000 people at work; record numbers of homeless; 50% of lone parent families experiencing deprivation and 61% of families struggling with education costs. That the forms of poverty have changed means that an organisation of brothers and sisters

that can change with them still needs to exist as well. In 2019, the members of the "The Society of St. Vincent de Paul" are as relevant today as they were when facing into the horrors of the famine in 1844.

The freshness of the SVP's responses to the changing face of poverty in Ireland is due both to the constant intake of new members, and that it provides a structure for us to exercise our Christian duty to the poor and vulnerable in a systematic and effective way. The Mass goers of St. Peter's Church are generous with their money through the regular collections, but perhaps you can give your time and talents as well, lest 'dropping a coin' become an excuse to ignore God's demand that we engage with the poor face to face directly and not through a collection bucket.

Today you heard the gospel of the Good Samaritan, so familiar that it is easy to ignore. There is however hidden behind the familiar storyline a direct call to each and every one of us to serve our neighbour especially the vulnerable. For those who are doing that already in other ways, God bless your work, but for those who have not yet found the right way to give expression to HIS calling, a couple of hours a week with brothers and sisters in a well run organisation will go a long way to fulfilling that obligation.
