# Worried and distracted by many things

Jesus didn't blame Martha for her hospitality. I suspect he loved her cooking. It was not her cooking, cleaning, or serving that bothered him. Notice the actual problem he describes: "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things."

The root meaning of the word "worry" is "strangle" or "seize by the throat and tear." The root meaning of the word "distraction" is "a dragging apart of something that should be whole."

Jesus found Martha in just such a state of fragmentation — a condition in which she could not enjoy his company, find inspiration in her work, receive anything he wished to offer her, or show him genuine love. All she could do was question his love ("Lord, do you not care?"), fixate on herself ("My sister has left me to do all the work by myself") and invite Jesus to complain too ("Tell her then to help me.")

Sound familiar? Do you find life so fragmented, so strangled, that you struggle to give and receive love? Are you quick to

seethe or get angry. Does your worry keeping you from being fully present, engaged, and alive? Are all the things you have to do a way to avoid intimacy with God or with others?

My answer to these is often yes. If yours is yes, too, then I wonder if we can hear Jesus's words to Martha, not as a criticism, but as an invitation. Not as a rebuke, but as a soothing balm. Jesus knows that we ache to be whole. He knows we can place difficult and devastating expectations on ourselves and that our resentments, like Martha's, are often borne of envy. Martha longed to sit where Mary sat. She longed to take delight in Jesus's words. She longed to surrender her heavy burden and allow Jesus to tend to her. Maybe we long for these good things, too.

Here's the good news: There is need of only one thing, and if we choose it, no one will ever have the power to take it away from us. So let's choose it. Jesus our gracious host is waiting.



# Eritrean Challenge

Irish Vincentian, Stephen Monaghan CM, has brought to our attention an unfolding situation in **Eritrea**, a country long associated with Vincentian missionaries..

Independent from Ethiopia since 1993, Eritrea was the mission focus of Vincentian saint, Justin deJacobus. The country is experiencing a serious Church State crisis, that effects the most vulnerable. After criticisms of the regime from the Catholic Bishops, the government has responded by closing all Catholic Medical Facilities.

The *Daughters of Charity* run a clinic St. George's, Waliku district of Keren, Eritrea's second largest city.. Specific information is scares, but all Catholic run centres in the city are reported closed.

Please include the Sister's and all Catholics of Eritrea in your prayers, that this situation will quickly resolve itself and regular service to the poorest and most vulnerable can be restored.
