Who is knocking on my door?

How mind-blowing it was for the first Disciples to hear Jesus telling them *"how to pray".*

It was not part of the prayer style of the Hebrews to call God "Abba", yet this was the teaching of Jesus to the Disciple's in what we now call *"The Lord's Prayer"*.

Using these words, Jesus was inviting the Disciples into a deeply personal relationship with Abba, Father, so different from the Temple Worship and the liturgy of the Synagogue.

The readings in the Liturgy of the Word this weekend illustrate that God's closeness in prayer and "God can be trusted to respond to our prayers".

The words of the Gospel of Luke say " Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find, knock and the door will open"

Just as we hear those words from Jesus, the Book of Revelation chapter 3:20 also echoes in my mind " Behold, I'm standing at the door, knocking. If your heart is open to hear my voice and you open the door within, I will come in to feast with you"

So, yes, we can knock and the door will be opened but what if Jesus is knocking and we are not opening?

We might have some of the most beautiful door knockers or the most hi-tech door bells and yet we may never hear Jesus knocking; something is knocking more loudly perhaps?

The knocking of our world? The knocking of our ego? The knocking of our desires?

We read in the Scriptures that Jesus went away from the hustle bustle, the noise of life, to the wilderness. There he would pray and listen to Abba His Father.

When do we get away from the hustle and bustle? To our own wilderness and listen to Abba our Father speaking to us, answering the knock of Jesus.

And when we answer the knocking what is it that Jesus wants? Revelation says: *"I will come in to feast with you"*

A feast, a celebration of nourishment and refreshment, joy and love, story and song, hospitality and companionship. Ready to begin again and face the world.

The Faith Journey is one of **asking**, **searching and knocking**. Activities that are done not just by us but by Jesus too who knocks on the door of our hearts. Can we hear it? And what is our answer?


