Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 30 June 2019

Sometime ago Phibsborough was named one of the coolest neighbourhoods in the world by Time Out magazine. It ranked the village in 27th place - ahead of neighbourhoods in San Francisco, Montreal, Shanghai and Boston. The magazine's editors say Phibsborough has become "more bustling than ever" since the Luas line appeared and modern cafés opening in previously dilapidated buildings. The towering cranes hanging over Grangegorman indicate further changes are on the way as we await the arrival of a possible 20.000 students.

In the 2016 Census 78.3% of respondents nationally described themselves as Catholic and of those living within the boundaries of St Peter's Parish, 45% identified themselves as so. Change is happening all around.

With change come both challenges and opportunities. So it was in 1838 when the Vincentian Community came to St Peter's. There was

CHANGE little of an organised spiritual nature to assist the thousands who lived in mud huts around the IS ALL church, yet within a few years the church needed to be expanded to cope with those attending and by 1845 the Vincent de Paul Society and The Ladies of Charity of St Peter's were supplying food and clothing to the poor in most of the north side of Dublin.

> The challenge for us as a Parish Community now is to continue to be a vibrant, compassionate space and place where people can enter in and be held, restored and transformed as they face the major issues of their lives. To be there for them when they come in joy to have a child baptised or when they come in grief to mourn the loss of those they have loved. To be a place where all are welcome and where the lonely find comfort and the searching find support for their quest. A community where the loving embrace of God con-

tinues to bring healing and hope to each of us. In January 2020 we will welcome back Fr Eamon Devlin as Parish Priest. 
