MISSION IN ACTION 2019 Vincentian Mission in Africa



In August 2019, on the invitation of the Vincentian Lay Missionaries (VLM), I visited the Vincentian Mission in Ambo, Ethiopia accompanied by my 15-year-old daughter Louise, we landed in Addis Ababa on Saturday, 2 August 2019.

We were met by Fr Asfaw Feleke CM, Vincentian Parish Priest of Ambo, who drove us the 110km journey to Ambo. Fr Asfaw and Fr Stephen Monaghan CM (a Vincentian from Dublin) run a small Catholic parish in the town of Ambo, which has an estimated population of 200,000. The main religions in Ethiopia are Coptic (Orthodox), Christian, Muslim and Protestant, with Catholics only accounting for a about 1%, so the congregation in Ambo is small. However, the work of the Vincentian Mission in Ambo is extensive




