WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

Love not in word but in deed

It was a sad day a year and a half ago when the doors of the Church of the Annunciation, Finglas West, were closed shut for the last time, locked and secured permanently. That was the moment the parishioners knew that the prospect of the churches demolition was real, it was going to happen. The Annunciation is my parish church, my mams parish church, friends from Finglas West parish church, closed now for ever.

I recall the times I sat in the pews as a 10vr old and the church was full to the rafters with up to 3,000 believers. Or trying to find standing room on Christmas Eve as parishioners pushed and shoved spreads. to see the crib.

On that final morning when the Blessed Sacrament was taken from the tabernacle and carried in procession to a new place of reposition again the people thronged, almost 4,000 thousand came to say farewell to that landmark that can be seen for miles around north Dublin.

Jesus says today "All these things you are staring at now, the time will come when not a single stone will be left." How true and poignant the words of Jesus are for the parishioners of West Finglas who wait now to see how the church building will be raised to the ground in the coming

But Jesus also says today "I myself will give you eloquence and wisdom" in the face of such hard and sad times. I see now how the faith community of Finglas West continues to live out the baptismal call of bringing Christ to the world. The faith community, which is now much smaller and gather

itself as the four walls of the church, the tabernacle, the shrines. God is present in the faith community of Finglas West, presently without a church building but almost certainly a church alive.

When the doors of the Annunciation closed the parishioners went from disciples to apostles, messengers of the faith and have grown stronger and deeper in their beliefs. One thing in particular that has happened is "God Talk". When the conversation starts about how sad it is for the church to close it inevitably leads to a conversation about faith and what we can all do to ensure Gods Word

I find myself asking questions: "when I leave the church after being nourished by Word and Sacrament how am I a disciple in the world? How am I becoming an Apostle following the command of Jesus to bring his Word to the four corners of the world"? "How am I the face of Christ to another"? Or, indeed "the holy Gospel that a person might encounter"?

When the new church is built it will be filled by the people of god, the faith community who are the church of disciples and apostles. Ready to come together to share table fellowship, hear the word of God, share in the Eucharist and be dismissed by the Priest when the celebration of the Eucharist ends "to bring Good News to the world".

The grace of God has come our way again. this time amid bad news and sadness and the grace of God will remain even when all things have perished and gone.




