Advent: Finding Time in a Busy Life!

Our Advent journey begins today. It is a busy time of year; our heads are filled with details to remember. It can be a stressful time with all of the expectations and challenges of relationships: who we want to be with and who we struggle to be with this Christmas. So, our hearts are a bit tender; finding true perspective can be elusive. With that in mind, here at St Peter's, we would like to offer you *three options*; one or more of which might help guide your Advent journey over the next few weeks!

1. A Week of Gentle Guided Prayer from 8th – 15th of December
2. A Thursday night adventure to learn about the Birth Stories of Jesus
3. An early Friday breakfast of Tea/Coffee, Croissants, Reflection & Prayer

Week of Guided Prayer

This is a chance to participate in a retreat which is done at home. During the week each person will meet with a trained prayer guide each day, either morning, afternoon or evening for a half hour meeting at your convenience, Monday to Friday. They will meet you in St Peter's and the only requirement is your commitment to pray for one half hour each day and to meet with your prayer guide.

Thursday Nights

Each Thursday evening at 7.30pm in Advent Fr Kieran O Mahoney, one of Ireland's leading scripture scholars, will help us explore how the story of the Birth of Jesus in Mathew's Gospel came to be shaped and written. Discover the background, context and the characters in the first two chapters of this Gospel. Come join us for coffee, chat and insight. Meet in the Frank Duff Room, St Peter's at 7.30pm, Dec 5th, 12th & 19th.

Friday Mornings

Start your Friday at 7.00am with Tea /Coffee and Croissants for a Prayer Breakfast. It's a chance to reflect and share on life and the gospel of the day. Finishes by 8.00am. We gather in St Peters Conference Room. Come join us for the Fridays of Advent. Entrance through Church, doors open from 6.45 am

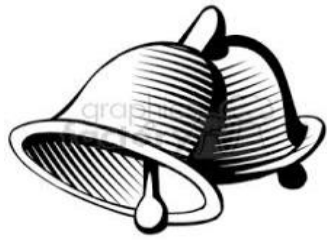
