So, our hearts are a bit tender; finding true perspective can be elusive. With that in mind, here at St Peter's, we would like to offer you three options; one or more of which might help guide your Advent journey over the next few weeks!

- A Week of Gentle Guided Prayer from 8th -15th of December
- 2. A Thursday night adventure to learn about the Birth Stories of Jesus
- 3. An early Friday breakfast of Tea/Coffee, Croissants, Reflection & Prayer

Week of Guided Prayer

This is a chance to participate in a retreat which is done at home. During the week each person will meet with a trained prayer guide each day, either morning, afternoon or evening for a half hour meeting at your convenience, Monday to Friday. They will meet you in St Peter's and the only requirement is your commitment to pray for one half hour each day and to meet with your prayer guide.

They will help you reflect on your experience and suggest material for you to pray with.

It begins with a group session on Sunday Dec 8th at 7.00pm and closes with a group session on Sunday Dec 15th at 7.00pm. 
Thursday Nights




