ST LOUISE DE MARILLAC: FEASTDAY 9 MAY

Louise was already widowed when she began to discern a calling to dedicate herself to the service of God. Through prayer and spiritual guidance with Vincent de Paul she devoted her considerable skills as an organiser and pragmatic helper to the care of sick and impoverished people, visiting them in their homes, setting up and running hostels for homeless and refugees, rescuing babies abandoned on the streets. As the needs grew so too did the generosity of young women who gathered around Louise to share her work. In this way the Daughters of Charity were formed in 1633. A community of sisters in St Peter's parish continues to live the charism of St Louise, visiting sick, ministering to homeless, caring for elderly people, assisting in parish.

LITURGICAL READINGS FOR: Sunday, 9 May 2021

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

You did not choose me, no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name.
