TRINITY SUNDAY

St Patrick proclaims his faith in the Blessed Trinity; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We read it in his own masterpiece, *The Confession*. He says 'There is no God; there never was, and never will be other than God the Father, and his Son, Jesus Christ who was made man; And who has poured out the Holy Spirit on us in abundance.... We acknowledge one God in the Trinity (par. 4)

Our Saint's image of the shamrock: one stem and three leaves portrays well the mystery of one nature of God in three Persons. Jesus says that to those who love him, he (Jesus) and the Father "will come to live" in them; and the "Holy Spirit shall be in" his true believers (John 14: 17,23)

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question, then, to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: the Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today, so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'

SECOND READING

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans
