The story raises interesting and challenging thoughts. Could it be that my relationship with God is so embedded in routine, some time, some prayers, some 'just do it, get it done and dusted approach'. Habit, routine, nothing more. So much so that it has lost meaning, relevance, real connection?

A more troubling question still..... could it be that I have boxed God in and consigned Him to a place in my life where there is little or no openness to the God of surprises? How about giving God a break, a holiday by doing something different to let fresh air blow through my relationship with Him these summer days?

The Parish Finance Committee met this week to review the parish finance statements for 2019 and 2020. As the Church was closed for several months (during the first lockdown, March till end of June) and as public Masses did not take place during this period and the second lockdown (August to 1 December), the decision was taken not to publish financial statements for 2019 as many people might not be able to avail of them. The statements for 2020 will reflect the serious impact of the pandemic on our financial situation, and the stark contrast between 2019 and 2020 will allow us to compare and contrast as we reflect on the reality of this situation which reflects of course the difficulties so many have had to cope with in their personal and employment realities.

I would like to express my profound gratitude to all of you for your loyalty and support to the parish throughout this period in spite of much uncertainty in your own circumstances. Thank you also for all the ways in which you continue to support the parish.
