# **PATIENT DETERMINATION ALWAYS**

Jesus in today's gospel speaks on the sufferings due to meet him in Jerusalem. His opponents would torture and kill him. But he would rise again in glory and bring salvation to us all.

The 1st Reading is a background to this climax of Christ's life of earth. This extract from the Book of Wisdom belongs to a wider wisdom literature of the Old Testament; it is a genre distinct from the books on history, prophets, liturgy, or legal themes. Wisdom writing deals with the Jewish faith in regard to daily life, relationships, family trials, suffering, rejoicing, good fortune, sickness, misfortune, preparation for life's ending.

Today's excerpt portrays mounting hostility against the wise person who is upright, religious, trusting God. This person is a clear reminder of Christ. The 2nd Reading utterly condems envy, greed, hatred, and calls for the pursuit of holy desires, finding fruit in peace and harmony.

Jesus (in the gospel) and the wise person (1st Reading) model for us fidelity, determination, calm living of the truth, patience in times of provocation and trial.

We pray for the realising of good desires, 'seeds bearing fruit in holiness!

#### FIRST READING

### A reading from the book of Wisdom

The godless say to themselves, 'Let us lie in wait for the virtuous man, since he annoys us and opposes our way of life, reproaches us for our breaches of the law and accuses us of playing false to our upbringing. Let us see if what he says is true, let us observe what kind of end he himself will have. If the virtuous man is God's son, God will take his part and rescue him from the clutches of his enemies. Let us test him with cruelty and with torture, and thus explore this gentleness of his and put his endurance to the proof. Let us condemn him to a shameful death since he will be looked after - we have his word for it.'

#### **SECOND READING**

### A reading from the letter of St. James

Wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony, and wicked things of every kind being done; whereas the wisdom that comes down from above is essentially something pure; it also makes for peace, and is kindly and considerate; it is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good; nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it. Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness. Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves? You want something and you haven't got it; so you

are prepared to kill. You have an ambition that you cannot satisfy; so you fight to get your way by force. Why you don't have what you want is because you don't pray for it; when you do pray and don't get it, it is because you have not prayed properly, you have prayed for something to indulge your own desires.

### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again'. But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him. They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child set him in front of them, put his arms round him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me
