HOSPITALITY

With the return to indoor dining in restaurants, cafes and hotels, many people are enjoying a much missed experience. As one patron expressed it succinctly on radio recently "the tea and toast served to you tastes better that the tea and toast you made at home." Something about being served, having it handed to you, makes a difference it seems. The hospitality industry, emphasis on "hospitality", has rediscovered its most lasting appeal, that action or interaction with the public that fulfils a simple social need, the gift and grace of human contact.

Grace builds on nature and so the Old Testament people, asked to choose, opt wholeheartedly to serve the God who has so graciously and generously served them, so long, and though thick and thin. Was it not the Lord our God who brought us out of Egypt, who worked those great wonders..? Their descendants, the people Jesus encounters in today's gospel, and ourselves by extension perhaps, are less amenable. They and we have been richly served, the gift of God Himself, the bread of angels and food that nourishes unto eternal life. Something in them, in we too however, baulks at such potential. Why is that? Why does the Eucharist leave us largely cold, untouched and unchanged? Something to do with service perhaps; where God is concerned, we prefer selfservice, no complication, nor commitment to follow through.

"What about you, do you want to go away too?" The Lord's question echoes down the centuries as many leave him and walk no longer with him. How each of us answers the question will depend much on our own personal awareness and appreciation of the divine hospitality expressed so simply in the words of consecration at the heart of every Mass — "Take this all of you and eat of it, for this is my Body given for you.

A reading from the Book of Joshua

SECOND READING

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body - and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one

body.

This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church. The Word of the Lord
