FEAST OF OUR LADY OF THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL

Saturday 27th November - Mass at 10.30am

The message of Our Lady at the Rue de Bac in November 1830 and the gift of the medal proclaim the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin. This truth is already enshrined in the earliest traditions of the faith of the Church. It is further proclaimed by Mary herself to Bernadette at Lourdes in 1858, 'Je suis l'Immaculée Conception.'

The shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal in our Church, and our weekly Novena proclaim the great privilege of Mary as the Immaculate Conception. To celebrate Our Lady of Graces we will have Mass each of the following evenings between the 27th November and the 8th December (Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception) at 6.00pm. Each evening will focus on one of Our Lady's titles as we reflect and pray about the place of Mary in our faith.

CHRISTIAN PERSECUTION AWARENESS "Week of Witness" 22nd - 26th November

Three hundred and forty million Christians around the world face significant persecution in their daily lives. Tens of thousands of Christians have been murdered, millions have been displaced, many have been abducted and numerous Christian places of worship have been desecrated or completely destroyed. In response to this situation a group of concerned citizens came together with the primary aim of raising awareness of this growing persecution. The group is called "Stop the Persecution of Christians - Dublin". In conjunction with the organisation Aid To The Church In Need our group will be organising a series of events during "Week of Witness" 22nd - 26th November.
