TAKING STOCK OF...

Pope Francis has asked the universal Church to embark on a synodal pathway. We tend to associate Synods as gatherings of bishops to reflect on issues facing the Church, leading to guidance and teaching for us as believers. The Pope desires that this synod include all of us who believe, and also that it reach out to those on the margins of the Church and people who do not identify with the Church any longer or at all.

The Irish Bishops announced a National Synod in March 2021, each Diocese is embarking on its synodal path and every parish in each diocese is asked to participate. We will reflect on our experience of Church, what encourages and discourages us, our role in the world in which we live, how best to move forward, hopes and regrets. The input of as many as possible will make our conclusions more real and the ways in which we listen to each other and to those on the margins will determine the quality of our proposals.

Beginning at parish pastoral council level and rippling outwards to all we pray for a spirit of prayer, listening, openness and acceptance to that all can be heard in an attitude of genuine co-responsibility.
