IN FORGIVING, WE ARE FORGIVEN (Prayer of St Francis)

At school once my teacher was lenient, and forgave me for an exercise that was inferior. I was very grateful to him, and his pupil did better work from then on! Forgiveness and mercy are highlighted in today's readings. 'God is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked' (Gospel). The first reading portrays amazing forgiveness by David towards Saul, who was waging a war against him. The second reading shows us Christ (the second Adam) bringing us a new life, including God's pardon; this we experience in a special way now in confession.

We are called to forgive. We know it's not always easy. We need to pray for it, as in the Our Father: 'Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive'. Forgiving is not naïve. It does not condone wrong done to us, but overlooks it. Forgiving may at times invite us to help the offender to change for the better. It is good to pray for those who harm us (Gospel). Forgiving sets us free.

LITURGICAL READINGS FOR: Sunday, 20th February 2022

FIRST READING

A reading from the first book of the Prophet Samuel Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph.

So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul lying asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him.

Then Abishai said to David, *Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice.*' David answered Abishai, 'Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt? David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them. David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David answered, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.

As this earthly man was, so are we on earth; and as the heavenly man is, so are we in heaven. And we, who have been modelled on the earthly man, will be modelled on the heavenly man.

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Jesus said to his disciples:

'But I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'
