FORGIVE, LORD, THE SIN THAT CLINGS

One of the saints of the early Church felt the need to offer something worthwhile to God and so prayed 'Lord, I offer you my life.' God however replied, 'It was I who gave you that. Your life is mine already.' 'True, Lord, then I offer you my heart and all its love.' 'It was I who gave you those as well. Why don't you give me your sins? They are all your own!'

We may have become so desensitised to sin in us that we don't see sin as anything special or to worry about. We may even have convinced ourselves that we have no real sin in our lives, not serious anyway and certainly not as bad as those of others and the evils of our world. God, we estimate, has enough to deal with in the world and in others, and our 'few' sins probably don't bother Him that much anyway. And so on it goes, our wonderful ability to rationalise our way out of trouble and the reality and seriousness of sin.

In today's readings the Lord strikes a cautionary note. The Chosen people, in spite of their privileged position, litter the desert as corpses through their preference for forbidden things over a right relationship with God. And the consequences of sin in the life of each of us ripples outwards and onwards socially, globally and in the end in our relationship with God Himself because we end by not needing Him as the one who saves us from our sins. Would Christ have come if sin were trivial? Would He have died? 'This is my blood poured out for you and for many ... for the forgiveness of sins'. Might my best prayer be for repentance?

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Exodus

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law, priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up.

'I must go and look at this strange sight,'

Moses said 'and see why the bush is not burnt.'

Now the Lord saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush.

'Moses, Moses!'

he said.

'Here I am' he answered.

'Come no nearer' he said. 'Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground.

I am the God of your father,' he said 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.'

At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God. And the Lord said.

'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. 'You are to say to the sons of Israel: "the Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. has sent me to you."

This is my name for all time; by this name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke
