IN GOD'S GOOD TIME

Time... too slow when you're waiting, too fast when you're late. Time, we're told, that is running out for our planet. Time, that seems to pass more swiftly as we grow older. Time and tide that wait for no one.

A note of urgency often characterises Jesus' sending out of disciples, calling them to mission. So much is at stake, time is of the essence — there is a rich harvest but it could be lost if the disciples don't act quickly. 'Go now' he tells them, don't hang about getting bogged down in small talk and niceties. Travel lightly, don't be cluttered with all the things you think you need. Don't be cowed by those who reject you or overawed by those who welcome you. Get straight to the point, tell it as it is, the message is not you but Jesus. He will see to it that the medium becomes the message if you simply let Him use you.

One of the many thoughts which responds to the Synodal Pathway prompts, from the responses of those who now see themselves outside the gift of faith is this — when so many no longer sense God in their lives or even in the world, are we running out of time? Have we idled while the reservoir of faith evaporated? And who will go in God's name to proclaim Him now, out of season and out of sync but with conviction? If any clarity is emerging on this last question it is that the Lord is looking to each of us who have some faith to decide to do something for Him and to do it deliberately and with conviction. Time is of the essence and for any good work we will find that He who made time has made plenty of it.

GOSPEL

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke

*The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of
him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He
said to them,*

*'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the
harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember,
I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no
haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road.*

*Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this
house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest
on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking
what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his
wages; do not move from house to house.*

*Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat
what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The
kingdom of God is very near to you".*

*But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome,
go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town
that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the
kingdom of God is very near."*

*I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that
town.*

The seventy-two came back rejoicing.

*'Lord,' they said 'even the devils submit to us when we use your
name.'*

He said to them,

'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven.

*Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions
and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you.
