NEW LIFE RISING FROM MERCY AND REPENTANCE

Rembrandt's 'The Return of the Prodigal Son' in St Petersburg (inset) is one of the most famous paintings of all time. It depicts the high point of today's Gospel parable (Luke 15). It opens the veil to a whole new world of relationship and God's mercy. Pardon totally conquers sin. The First Reading (Exodus 32) is the background. There Moses begs God to forgive the Israelites who have stooped to base idolatry and denied God. God relents and absolves the sinners, who are asked in return to show signs of repentance. The Second Reading (1 Timothy 1) tells us that Christ has gained salvation for us sinners.

The spendthrift youth of the Gospel is chastened by the sad results of his sin, but filled by his father's love remembered. His father runs out to embrace the son. I like to think of the son also as running to his father. The father allows the young man to make his confession, express his loathing for his bad life, and promise of amendment. Then celebration is unconfined. If this were a modern TV series, I imagine that the former sinner would go on to be a saintly parishioner. Besides, I'd hope that the elder brother, always at home, everfaithful, became fully reconciled to his transformed sibling.



At all events, this astonishing epic offers hope to even the most unpromising sinners. This intimate encounter with God (figured in the parable) is an invitation to all.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Exodus

The Lord spoke to Moses,

"Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostasised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. Here is your God, Israel," they have cried "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!"

The Lord said to Moses,

'I can see how headstrong these people are! Leave me, now, my wrath shall blaze out against them and devour them; of you, however, I will make a great nation.'

But Moses pleaded with the Lord his God.

'Lord,' he said 'why should your wrath blaze out against this people of yours whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with arm outstretched and mighty hand? Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, your servants to whom by your own self you swore and made this promise: I will make your offspring as many as the stars of heaven, and all this land which I promised I will give to your descendants, and it shall be their heritage for ever.'

So the Lord relented and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.
