Those who do will be blessed with a budget bonanza from the Lord Himself, the giver of all good gifts. The promise of God to those who budget for faith is sure even if "it comes slowly ... come it will, without fail ... the upright will live by his/her faithfulness."

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of the Prophet Habakkuk

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tvrannv?

Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes.
