ALWAYS GIVING THANKS - Pope Francis's Prayer for Families

St Faustina in 1935 paid a visit home to her family in Glogowiec, Poland after 10 years in the convent. She tells us that after initial greetings they all knelt down 'to thank God for the grace of being together once again in this life.' The 1st Reading (2 Kings) records a great miraculous cure of leprosy through the prophet, Elisha (c. 850 BC). The healed man, named Naaman, a pagan from Syria, is delighted, and pours forth the most heartfelt thanks to the one God. St Paul in the 2nd Reading (2 Timothy), expresses deep appreciation to Christ who has saved us. We are to show our thanks in faithfulness to Christ, who is always faithful and trustworthy. I often notice a good culture of showing gratitude. I hear choruses of thanks at checkouts, in public offices, medical locations and when passengers alight from buses. One of the ten men healed in today's Gospel returns to thank Jesus, and praise God for the marvel granted to him. Jesus commends him for his spirit of recognising the gift of God, and for his faith which impelled him. We know about gratitude, not least when we receive it ourselves. It is more than mere words. It is an attitude of soul, a virtue and habit of the heart. Supreme thanks are manifested at the Mass. Jesus took the bread and wine and gave thanks (EUCCHARIST), then changed them to his Body and Blood. Being thankful is charity; it's a sign that we are not totally self-sufficient; we need help from other people and from God.

FIRST READING

A reading from the second Book of Kings

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child.

Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him.

'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing'. Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, '*Since your answer is "No", allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.*
