Holy Souls

The Taxman was a cad, and he knew it. But he knew something else, that God is merciful despite all the misery he had caused. Notice his stance "at some distance" and his gesture "he beat his breast" (like we do when we say *confiteor*), notice especially his humble prayer, "GOD, BE MERCIFUL TO ME, A SINNER".

The Pharisee thought that his Jewish religion was all a meritocracy; that it was all a merit-badge-system – all achievement, accomplishment, performance and perfection. The good people win and the bad people lose. Of course, once we cast religion as a win-lose scenario, the irony is that everybody loses.

Jesus' good news is that God's choice is always for the excluded one, the sinner. Jesus learned this from his Jewish tradition: God always chooses the rejected son, the barren woman, the people enslaved in Egypt or exiled in Babylon. It's not a winner's script in the Bible - it's a loser's script. It's a loser's script where, ironically, everybody wins.

Competitive games are definitely not the way of God.

God gets more joy at what you are – God's child, Jesus' sister/brother - than vexation at your weakness or sins.

Make your prayer the Taxman's prayer, and say it every day: JESUS, SON OF GOD, BE MERCIFUL TO ME, A SINNER.

#### **FIRST READING**

A reading from the Book of Ecclesiasticus

The Lord is a judge who is no respecter of personages. He shows no respect of personages to the detriment of a poor man.

he listens to the plea of the injured party.

He does not ignore the orphan's supplication,

The first time I had to present my defence, there was not a single witness to support me. Every one of them deserted me — may they not be held accountable for it. But the Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
