## SPREADERS OF THE SACRED FIRE

The Church of Saint-Séverin is a Catholic Church in the Latin Quarter of Paris, on the lively tourist street Rue Saint-Séverin. It was re-built and extended in flamboyant gothic style in C16th. Remarkable are the twisting 'sugar-stick' columns of the sanctuary. Of significant note are the seven modern stained-glass windows representing the Seven Sacraments. They were designed by **Jean René Bazaine** and replace those destroyed during WW2. The glass depicting the Sacrament of Priesthood is a riot of blue, yellow and bright red flames. The caption for this window is: **I have come to cast fire on the earth and how I wish it were blazing.** (Luke 12,49)

Jesus came to torch the world with the heat and light of the Divine Spirit, which is none other than the love shared by the Father and the Son, the inner life of God.

Jesus is a prophet because He teaches;

Jesus is a king because He leads and shepherds;

but Jesus is a priest because He is the spreader of the sacred fire.

Like Peter and others, Jesus says to you "follow me" and so share in His priesthood. You are invited to spread the sacred fire that can set the world ablaze.

#### **FIRST READING**

A reading from the book of the Prophet Isaiah

In days past he humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in days to come he will confer glory on the Way of the Sea on the far side of Jordan, province of the nations. The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase:

they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time. as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian.

## SECOND READING

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to Corinthians

I appeal to you, brothers, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice.

From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul, 'I am for Apollos,' 'I am for Cephas,' 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul?

For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

'Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan,

Galilee of the nations!

The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned.'

From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand'.
