GOOD CHOICES SHAPING LIFETIMES

St Vincent de Paul (1581-1660) began as a young priest with worldly ambitions. Various events and hard knocks slowed down his youthful haste. A winding road and some great people led Vincent to choose the design of God. Then a new inspiring vision gradually opened up before him. The grace of God, well accepted, and love for the needy entered into a blossoming ideal.

The 1st Reading (Ecclesiasticus 15, 2nd century BC) poses key issues that call us to choose good things, virtues: the wisdom of the Lord. Today's Gospel from the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5) asks us to opt for the full depths of Christ's teaching on several of the Ten Commandments. Observance of these divine norms brings to the person well-being and peaceful conscience. The Lord presents the following: truth and charity (5th and 8th commandments); chastity and sexual morality (6th and 9th commandments); family duties and obedience (4th commandment).

St Paul in the 2nd Reading (1 Corinthians 2) points us to the pathways that present good choosing: maturity grows fruitfully and patiently out of faithful devotion and lasting integrity.

A young saint gives us all good advice:

"I choose to do everything. even the smallest things, for the greater glory of God." St Dominic Savio (1842-1857)

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Ecclesiasticus

If you wish, you can keep the commandments, to behave faithfully is within your power.

He has set fire and water before you; put out your hand to whichever you prefer.

Man has life and death before him; whichever a man likes better will be given him.

For vast is the wisdom of the Lord; he is almighty and all-seeing. His eyes are on those who fear him, he notes every action of man. He never commanded anyone to be godless, he has given no one permission to sin.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

Response: They are happy who follow God's law!

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

We have a wisdom to offer those who have reached maturity: not a philosophy of our age, it is true, still less of the masters of our age,

which are coming to their end. The hidden wisdom of God which we teach in our mysteries is the wisdom that God predestined to be for our glory before the ages began. It is a wisdom that none of the masters of this age have ever known, or they would not have crucified the Lord of Glory; we teach what scripture calls: the things that no eye has seen and no ear has heard, things beyond the mind of man, all that God has prepared for those who love him.

These are the very things that God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit reaches the depths of everything, even the depths of God.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'Do not imagine that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets. I have come not to abolish but to complete them. I tell you solemnly, till heaven and earth disappear, not one dot, not one little stroke, shall disappear from the Law until its purpose is achieved. Therefore, the man who infringes even one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be considered the least in the kingdom of heaven; but the man who keeps them and teaches them will be considered great in the kingdom of heaven.

'For I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven The Gospel of the Lord.
