SPADEWORK IN OUR FAITH

As we follow Christ, we are sometimes blessed with times of great joy and love, times of insight and understanding, and we want to stay there. There are times when it all makes sense, when we feel close to God, and experience a sense of his presence that we never want to let go of. They're the times when we're like Peter, we want to remain there. We want the good times to last. We want faith experiences always to be uplifting, dazzling even. But we can't stay there. Quite a lot of the time, our faith journey is uphill, like climbing a mountain. Sometimes it's a struggle, sometimes its boring, mundane. We wonder where God is, what's it all about, does he listen to our prayers?

For some Lent may well be a joyless time, a time for doing without and not too many highs. But for us who believe, joy should characterise our Lent, because this season is all about renewal, turning to God again as we prepare for the celebration of Easter and all that means. This is the time to do a bit of spadework in our faith, the time to deepen our relationship with God, to tackle the obstacles to faith in our lives, to discipline ourselves as disciples as we follow our Risen Lord on this journey of faith. And it's not too late to start. May the experience of the transfiguration be for us an encouragement in these Lenten days, sustaining us on our spiritual journey.



A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew
