THE PRESENCE AND INFLUENCE OF GOD WITH US

After his conversion to the Catholic Church, St Augustine (354 - 430) wrote in his Confessions: "Lord, I tasted you, and now hunger and thirst for you. You touched me and I have burned for your peace."

Scripture

Today's Scripture offers us a strong intimation of God's glory in us, and it radiates out into good lives. Like St Augustine we can be permeated by the grace of God. The preaching of St Philip in the 1st Reading (Acts 8) works a revolution in the culture of Samaria; there was great rejoicing! St Peter in the 2nd Reading (1 Peter 3) encourages his Christians to be faithful and they can be sure of God's protection in difficult times. In the Gospel (John 14), Jesus gives profound teaching on the call to close relationship with God. Peace is a quality in this context. It is a peace of the heart coming from obedience to the Commandments, doing the divine will. Our lives return God's love for us. The Holy Spirit ties the bonds between us and God. God's presence is most important here. We believe God is everywhere, in all things, keeping everything in existence. A higher quality of presence exists in human beings in the state of grace, especially in the baptised. The unique presence of Christ, of God, is realised in the Real Presence: Holy Communion and the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacles of our churches. This seems clearly the climax of St Augustine's expression: his hunger and thirst to taste God.

Conclusion

We need to give attention to these great truths, especially now. We live in an atmosphere of speed, words and sounds, that close out the spiritual hungers, if we let them. We take a bit of time out, we let ourselves be filled with the grace of the Lord. Jesus is with us, does not leave us orphans, but manifests himself to us (today's Gospel).

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town. When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring.

And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong. Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.


