PENTECOST; GOD'S SPIRIT RESIDENT IN YOU

JOY is the flagship of God's Holy Spirit.

I worked for many years in a London Centre for homeless people. It was located near Victoria rail station and close to Buckingham Palace. I learned that when the Queen (Elizabeth all my time) was in residence the Union flag flew over the Palace.

One of the "fruits" of the presence of God's Spirit in us is JOY. St Paul puts joy near to the top of a list of "fruits" of God's Spirit. In his Letter to Galatia (Turkey) he says "The fruit of the Spirit is love, JOY, peace and kindness..."

When the Risen Christ visited his disciples on Easter evening and conferred on them the Holy Spirit and power to forgive sins "they were filled with JOY" (today's gospel).

When your life is filled with JOY, you are like Buckingham Palace, God's Holy Spirit is in residence.

JOY is the flag indicating that God's Spirit is resident in you.

LITURGICAL READINGS FOR: Sunday, 28 May 2023

FIRST READING

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome- Jews and proselytes alike-Cretans and Arabs.' SECOND READING

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
